> Pin A Message: This fundraising initiative was thought up and administered by Ally Wilcox. The total raised was $\$ 70.00$. The amount was donated to the Church.
> We Rock Kindness: This is a mental health initiative put on by the Healthy School Committee. Children may be recognized for doing kind acts. The kind acts will be recorded and posted in booklet form on the We Rock Kindness board. For the two weeks following the March Break, students from the Healthy School committee took turns at reading tips on how to improve and/or maintain mental health.
> Mrs. Guay's class is spearheading a Lenten project: students are asked to bring in non-perishable packable lunch snacks to be donated to the Women's Rural Resource Center. The snacks are to be food items not drinks. For every donation a child makes a footprint will be placed on the wall leading from their classroom to the front foyer area.
> French culture was enjoyed at OL despite the snow!
Feb 23-Carnaval for all primary students, hosted by Grades $5 / 6$ students.
Feb. 24 - tubing was a great success as the students were able to tube in T-shirts!

- Carryover from last year: $\$ 9,359.26$ - $\$ 850.66$ milk term $32016=\$ 8,508.26$
- Projected earnings this year: $\$ 19,327.85$
- Less Budget of: $\$ 14,925+\$ 493.54$ (benches, alter) + \$367.50 (hotlunches.net) = \$15,786.04
- $\quad$ Surplus for this year: $\$ 19,327.85-\$ 15,786.04=\$ 3,541.81$

Budget for 2017/18: will increase by $\$ 405$ (bus increase) $+\$ 367.50$ aprox. (hotlunches.net) $=\$ 15,698$

- Hot lunch / milk generally bring in profit of $\$ 10,000$
- Which means council will need to fundraise $\$ 6,000$ from other events to cover budget, or dip into the carry forward from 2016/17 and review budget for 2018/19 to decrease if we do not achieve the budget

Safety Day at OLI: Tuesday May 9th, 2017

- OLI has been selected as this year's LDCSB location to host Safety Day
a) note \& permission forms will go home later in April to students in grades 2-8
b) many community partners involved (such as: police, fire, 911 dispatch, EMS, etc.)
c) event is FREE to the school; students receive a t-shirt \& take home bag
d) committee asks that the Parent Council arrange \& provide a lunch for the volunteers
e) council will be reimbursed up to $\$ 250$ to cover the costs of the lunch (est. 25-30 people)
f) suggested: salad, sandwiches/wraps, drinks (water, juice, pop), dessert/goodie tray
- Let's Get Cookin' Program-ask council for $\mathbf{\$ 2 0 0}$ for this program
a) the equipment is OLI's, and can be used each year to continue the program
b) the students (if able) bring in $\$ 10$ each to offset the cost of groceries
c) preliminary estimates are that the cost to run the program is approx. $\$ 100$ for printing, supplies (plates, cups, cutlery, paper towel, soap, etc.) over \& able what is contributed by the students for groceries
d) this year we should be 'okay', have enough funds. MLHU has given OLI a $\$ 100$ gift car for Food Basics for each of the classes this year.
e) benefits of the program, value to the school community, etc.
f) the plan is to continue it each year for the Gr . 5 s (if there are volunteers to do so)
g) as time goes on, items will need to be replaced - would like to see a 'kitty' for this
h) grocery costs fluctuate (season, availability, markets, sales, etc.) so it will change every time the program is run
i) to encourage volunteers, they can be assured that there is money available to cover additional costs \& they will not have to pay out-of-pocket for things
